Sharing the Road

Tips for sharing the road with snow plows.

Stay back at least 70-feet. There may be sand or salt being dropped from the truck which could damage your vehicle. This will also give you enough room to stop safely if the snow plow has to stop quickly.

Give the snow plow room to work. The driver's field of vision may be restricted by parts of the plow. Remember, if you can't see the mirrors of the plow truck, the driver may not be able to see you.

If the truck is plowing snow, DON'T PASS! Snow plows can create clouds of blowing snow that can inhibit the drivers view and they may not be able to see you trying to pass. You

may not be able to see the plow blades or oncoming traffic through the blowing snow. Remember, the road surface behind the truck is safer than the road surface in front of the truck.

Give space at intersections. The snow plow may need two or more lanes to turn or get through the intersection. If a snow plow is waiting to turn left at an intersection, do not pull up and stop underneath or in front of the wing plow (the plow attached to the right side of the truck). This plow can be either in your lane or above your lane, in which case, your vehicle could be struck by the plow, when the truck pulls forward.

Remember, the plows are there to make the roads safer for all road users. This isn't a race, give them space!



Government Corner

A letter from your Town Administrator

Dear Boonville Residents,

Happy New Year! Since the fall edition of the newsletter, the Town of Boonville has continued to make progress with its water and sewer infrastructure upgrades.

The sewer project is almost completed although the extremely cold temperatures have caused some delays. We expect Plant 1 to begin its final test on January 5. If the test is successful, Plant 1 will go on line the

week of January 8, and Plant 2 will slowly be drained to start its recoating process.

Part B of the water project is also underway. A new well has been drilled and is producing favorably. The next step will be testing to confirm that the water is viable.

Along with infrastructure upgrades, Town employees are taking proactive steps to prepare for winter weather. During a forecasted inclement weather event, Town employees monitor the weather conditions and normally pretreat the roads. When the snow removal process begins, there is

no set route. Public Works Department staff will start their snow removal process on primary roads and then move to the secondary roads. Please keep in mind that the Town is not responsible for US Hwy 601, NC 67, River Road, and Sunset Drive. These roads are maintained by NCDOT.

RECYCLE RIGHT. Things you can do to ensure quality material is recycled:



DO NOT INCLUDE: Food waste, plastic bags, polystyrene foam cups & containers, hangers or hazardous waste

- Paper and cardboard must be dry and free of food debris.
- Tissues, paper towels or other paper that has been in contact with food is not acceptable.
- Make sure food contamination and caps are removed from cans and plastics and all containers are empty.
- Separate plastic lids from plastic bottles (often made from different materials).
- Do not place medical waste (needles, catheters or lancets) into the recycling containers.
