Community Yard Sale

Blueberry Pie Recipe

It is blueberry season and we have an easy to make blueberry pie recipe!

Ingredients

- 1 refrigerated pie crust
- 4 cups of freshly picked blueberries from the Green Mesa Blueberry Farm
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 1/2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1/2 teaspoon grated lemon peel

Instructions

1. Roll out one sheet pie crust to flatten. Fit into a 9-inch pie dish.
2. In a medium sauce pan combine 1 cup of the blueberries, sugar,

cornstarch and 2 tablespoons of water. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until mixture is thickened and clear. Stir in butter; cool for 5 minutes. Stir in the remaining 3 cups of blueberries and lemon peel.

3. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Turn cooled filling into pie shell. Lay the remaining pie crust

on a sheet of wax paper. Roll out to flatten. With a knife or pastry wheel cut pastry into 3/8-inch wide strips. Arrange in a criss-cross pattern on top of blueberries, pressing ends into the edges of the bottom crust and crimping to seal.

4. Place pie on a baking sheet. Bake in the third of oven until crust is golden and filling bubbles gently, about 30 minutes. Cool on rack.

Serve with a scoop of your favorite vanilla ice cream!

Summer Safety Tips



Enjoy some helpful tips on keeping you and your family safe in the summer months in Boonville!

- Sparklers and fireworks that are commonly considered safe can reach high temperatures and cause sever injuries
- Use a lawn mower that stops the blade if the handle is released
- Black asphalt attracts the sun’s UV rays and traps heat, making the surface temperature sky rocket. If your pet steps on hot pavement, he or she could burn their paws



- Bike helmets should cover the forehead and sit level on the child’s head. Fasten the helmet tight enough that two fingers fit between the chin and strap
- Make sure children avoid pipes, drains, and other openings in pools, there are often dangerous high suction in these areas
- At the playground, ensure kids cannot reach any parts that will trap or pinch body parts.
- Avoid the sun when it’s strongest between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

- When removing insect stingers, back them out carefully by scraping backwards over the sting

- Drink plenty of water and avoid sugary, caffeinated and alcoholic drinks to avoid dehydration



- Use a sunscreen with an SPF of 30+ and reapply every two hours
