# Town of Boonville March 3, 2020, Regular Meeting Minutes Harvey E. Smith Municipal Building

The following were in attendance at the 3/3/20 regular meeting: Mayor Vaughn Benton, Commissioners William Paul Baity, Monica Craver, Richard Lasky, Justin Phillips, and Tony Reece. Also in attendance were Town Attorney James Freeman, Finance Officer/Town Clerk Kim Wells, Public Works Director Jeff Jones, and Police Chief Jeff Hobson.

- I. Call to Order and Welcome: Mayor Benton called the 3/3/20 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- II. Conflict of Interest Issues and Approval of Agenda: Public Works Director Jones stated that WithersRavenel had a scheduling conflict and requested that the Board members remove Item VII. New Town Business, A, until a later date. Commissioner Craver asked the Board members to table VII. New Town Business, B until the April meeting. She informed the Board members that only one quote had been received, and she hoped to have a second quote by the April meeting. Commissioner Baity motioned to approve the agenda as amended. Commissioner Lasky seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.
- III. Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer: Mayor Benton led the Pledge of Allegiance and the prayer.
- **IV. Adoption of minutes:** Commissioner Baity motioned to approve the 2/4 regular and 2/4 closed session minutes as presented. Commissioner Reece seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.
- **V. Public Comments:** Lynn and Glen Trivette, Cherry St. Ext, voiced concerns about a fallen building in the ETJ. They asked about a missing street sign and expressed interest in the addition of a streetlight on NC 67 for public safety.

#### VI. Old Town Business:

- A. Update on Water and Sewer Projects, including passage of resolution for loan increase for sewer plant: Public Works Director Jones updated the Board members on the sewer plant and well house rehabilitation. He stated the new well, Sunset Ridge Well, is in the process of being connected to the water system. Public Works Director Jones and Finance Officer/Town Clerk Wells reported on the proposed resolution. Commissioner Baity motioned to approve Resolution #2020-2. Commissioner Phillips seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.
- **B.** Town Parking: Public Works Director Jones stated that he is in the process of getting quotes for the paving of the Town lot for parking. He said that he estimated the cost would be approximately \$25,000. Discussion followed on the access to NC67/US601 from the lot.
- C. Logo for Town Water Tank: The Board members discussed adding the Town's logo to the water tank. Public Works Director Jones stated that he spoken to the contractor, and it was his understanding that the cost would be a one-time fee. After that, it would be included in the normal painting schedule. Discussion followed. Commissioner Lasky motioned to put the logo on the tank. Commissioner Reece seconded. The motion passed with a 3-2 vote, with Commissioners Craver and Phillips voting against. It was the consensus of the Board members to clarify in the March minutes that the logo fee would be a one-time purchase in the amount of \$14,400 for one side of the tank, and that in the future, this should be included in the regular maintenance and should not be an additional fee per contract.

#### VII. New Town Business:

**A. EW2 Environmental Quote:** Public Works Director Jones reviewed a proposed quote for the annual maintenance of the UV lights at the sewer plant. Commissioner Baity motioned to accept the quote from EW2 Environmental Inc., for \$2,477.20. Commissioner Craver seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

#### VIII. Reports and announcements:

- A. Mayor's report: Mayor Benton reported that he had been contacted by the Yadkin County Manager, Lisa Hughes. She is hosting a workshop on Friday, March 13, for the new Land Use Law that will go into effect on January 1, 2021. He stated that he was planning to attend the workshop and would like Steve Hutchens to also attend.
- **B.** Finance Officer's report: Finance Officer/Town Clerk Wells asked the Board members to begin looking at possible dates for the first budget workshop. She has distributed all of the forms to the department heads for their preliminary numbers. She asked Public Works Director Jones if we could have the Rural Water Association reevaluate the water and sewer rates so the Town can

- account for the increase in the loan for the sewer plant. She then reviewed the Budget vs. Actual report.
- C. Public Works Director's report: Public Works Director Jones had no additional items to report.
- **D.** Police Chief's report: Police Chief Hobson reported that the new part-time officer, Haley Beam, was being trained.
- **E.** Fire Department's Reports: Fire Chief Brandon Renegar reviewed the stations statistics for the previous year. He stated that the Fire Department was working to get the Boonville insurance rating lower with the next assessment. He then reported on planned budget workshops for the Fire Department and planned hydrant testing in May.
- F. Departmental Commissioner's Reports: No commissioners had any items to report.
- G. Committee reports as needed: None was voiced.
- IX. Closed Session per NCGS 143-318.11(a)(6) Personnel: Commissioner Baity motioned to go into closed session per NCGS 143-318.11(a)(6)-Personnel. Commissioner Phillips seconded, and the motioned passed unanimously at 7:49 p.m.

Commissioner Baity motioned to return to open session. Commissioner Lasky seconded, and the motioned passed unanimously at 8:00 p.m.

Commissioner Baity motioned to hire David Craver at \$15.00 per hour as a part-time Police Officer. Commissioner Reece seconded. The motioned passed with a 4-0 vote with Commissioner Craver recusing herself from voting.

Commissioner Craver motioned that Steve Hutchens be given a 4 percent with an hourly rate of \$14.75 to become effective next pay period. Commissioner Reece seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

XII. Recess: The Board members discussed possible dates for a budget workshop. Commissioner Baity motioned to recess until 10:00 a.m., on March 30. Commissioner Reece seconded, and the motioned passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 8:09 p.m.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF TOONVILLE:


That the Town of Boonville does hereby accept the State Revolving Loan increase offer of \$515,960 for a total amount of \$1,372.035.


